Discussion:

Policies/Procedures – The Board discussed reviewing and revising several policies and procedures. Additional policies need to be written pertaining to annual staff trainings, document retention and child safety. The Board is seeking and receiving additional insight from OSBA (Oregon School Boards Association) and the Corvallis School District with regards to drafting these important policies.

Classroom Configuration – By the March 13th meeting, the Board needs to decide on class configurations for next year. The enrollment process will begin in March and determining class configurations is an essential step in responding to applications for admission to MCCS. There is strong support for keeping the current grade configurations, but input and ideas are both welcome and encouraged!

Reports:

School Lunch – The stove ansul system must be replaced in order for the MCCS kitchen to remain up to code. Lunch program costs are higher than income and work is being done to find ways to save money. The Board is committed to continuing the lunch program through the end of the year and will discuss the future of the program at that time. Many thanks to Kristina Rosenbaum, Melissa Cunningham all the lunch volunteers for your hard work!

Charter Renewal – The Corvallis School District recommended that our charter be renewed and the CSD Board voted to renew the Muddy Creek Charter School charter. The CSD Board expressed concerns about our test scores in math and reading, but the District is also looking for other ways to assess MCCS's success. Dan will be developing a reporting system.

Nonprofit Board Training – Several Board Members attended the 10th Annual Nonprofit Training offered by the Center for Nonprofit Stewardship (an organization located in Philomath). The training provided valuable resources for Board development and growth.

Board Report – MCCS teachers and staff attended a math training and a Love & Logic training. MCCS is applying to become a Love & Logic Institute.

Budget Report – Financials are in order and funding is available to make some much needed facility repairs. Discussed options for spending unrestricted donations on artists in residence to support MCCS's mission to integrate art in education.

Why does ICP exist?

Every charter school is required by law to have a board of directors who are ultimately responsible for the school's performance. Inavale Community Partners (ICP) is a community based non-profit organization founded in 2006 whose principal mission is to support and sustain the rural community living in unincorporated parts of South Benton County. Muddy Creek Charter School is ICP's primary project.

What does the board do exactly?

The board is responsible for creating and upholding the mission and vision of MCCS. The board writes policies and procedures for the school that support the school's mission and vision, direct various school operations, provide financial stewardship of its assets and ensure that all legal requirements are met.

Who can join the board and how?

Who can come to board meetings?
