Reports:

School Report – The enrollment lottery will be held this month, and there are many applications for enrollment for the 2014/15 school year (particularly in kindergarten).

Teachers have attended several trainings and are finding these trainings very helpful. Several staff members will be attending a training on interventions for students with special needs.

Budget Report - The Board discussed financial

factors that require some minor adjustments to the budget. While some expenditures have increased, the school is still in good financial standing. Due to ample carryover, there will be extra funding available to repair the gym roof over the summer.

Discussion:

Classroom Configuration – After thorough consideration of Staff input and recommendations, the Board has decided to keep classroom configurations for the 2014/15 school year the same: one K, two 1/2, one 3/4 and one 4/5.

Traffic Safety Light – Dave Buchanan has been researching options for increasing traffic/student safety in the MCCS school zone. He will continue to research grants and other funding options to install blinking yellow lights. In the meantime, other options are being explored to reduce speeding violations in our school zone.

Gym Roof Repair – A big thank you to Tim Martin for gathering bids and offering his expert guidance in finding the best option for completing the repairs for the gym roof. The Board will be voting on funding these repairs during the April Board meeting.

Policy/Procedure Updates – The Board is working to draft and approve several new policies. Several Board members will be organizing a committee to edit and prepare final drafts for Board review and approval.
